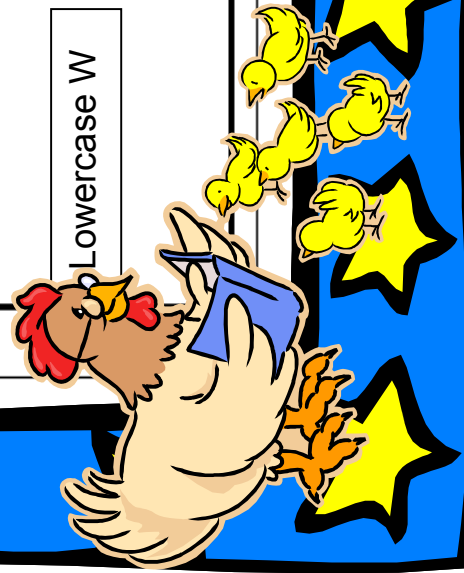


# Capital Matching

Uppercase a	Lowercase M	Lowercase W

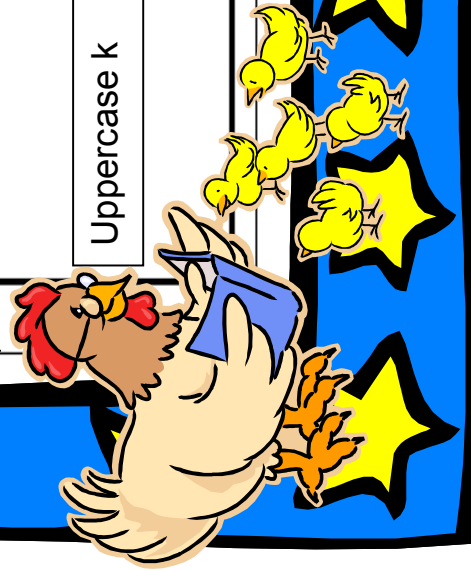
Authors often CAPITALISE when they want something to REALLY stand out.

Use capitals to start sentences.

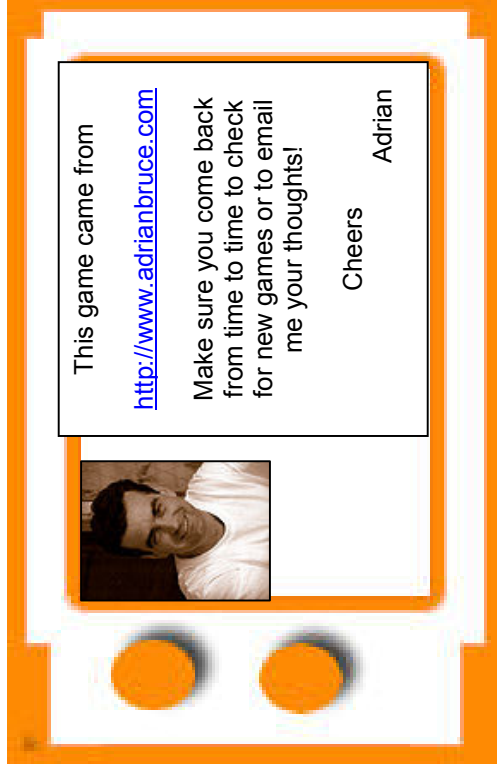


# Capital Match

**Capital Match** is a Bingo like game for 4 or 5 players where a dealer reads the cards aloud and calls '**capital** \_\_\_' or '**lowercase** \_\_\_' and shows it to the group.

If a player has a match they call out 'Here' and the dealer gives the card to them and they place it on the appropriate spot on their board.

The winner is determined by the person who covers all the squares first.
